EXPANSION

In 2021, the United Way of Marion and Taylor Counties and the Randolph County United Way merged to create the Tygart Valley United Way. As a regional United Way, TVUW covers Marion, Randolph, Taylor, Barbour, and Tucker counties.

INVOLVEMENT

Over 120 local businesses partner with United Way to conduct their annual fundraising campaign. Last year, over 450 volunteers assisted the organization.

EFFICIENCY

The administrative rate of 9.1% is significantly lower than the average of 35% recommended by the Charities Review Council.

RESULTS

United Way and its funded partners are working to address the needs in our three impact areas of Health, Education, and Financial Stability.

- Over 34,289 meals served to families and individuals in need
- Families saved over \$75,200 in tax prep fees using VITA tax prep
- 5,912 individuals received emergency financial assistance

Funding supports 46 programs at 39 health and human service agencies across all five counties.

COVID-19

United Way established the COVID-19 Response and Recovery Fund and distributed over \$120,000 to over 42 organizations. Since then, United Way has worked 24/7 to identify needs, fill gaps, and be a reliable source of assistance to our communities.

RESOURCES

In addition to the annual fundraising camapign, United Way also generated over \$132,000 in grants and sponsorships. Non-financial contributions in the form of in-kind gifts are valued at over \$80,000.
